## Garbage Disposal and Recycling

### GARBAGE DISPOSAL

We ask for the cooperation of all residents and businesses to assist the Town by remembering the following guidelines for garbage disposal:

White Goods. The Town Shop accepts refrigerators, stoves, freezers, dishwashers, washers, and dryers. You must first pay a fee at the Town office, and *only* upon proof of purchase to Public Works staff, can you drop your white goods off at the Town yard.

Dry Rubble. All dry rubble is to be taken to the transfer site. This includes furniture, mattresses, and **microwaves**.

Brush and Branches. The Town prefers all brush and branches be taken to the Transfer Site; however, if this is not possible, we ask that you take them to the north end of the Town Shop yard where they can be dropped.

Compost. The composting pile is *located* at the Public Works yard and is available to the public anytime. We ask that you drop off your grass clippings, garden waste, leaves, organics, and anything else that can be composted.

Cardboard. The Recycling Depot has a spot for cardboard, and we ask that you use the depot for disposal of your cardboard items. If you find it too inconvenient to prepare your cardboard for the Recycling Depot, there is a drop-off for cardboard at Eckville Super Service.

### RECYCLING DEPOT

The Town encourages residents of Eckville to use the recycling bins at the corner of so" Street. Following are items that are acceptable at the Recycling Depot:

Paper. Newspapers, inserts, magazines, catalogues, writing paper, computer paper, cards, junk mail, paper bags, envelopes, paperback and hardcover books (remove hard covers), phone books, paper egg cartons. Place shredded paper in a separate bag.

Cardboard. Flattened, corrugated cardboard boxes, food boxes (remove and discard liner), milk cartons (rinse and flatten), shoe boxes, brown paper bags, juice boxes. Large cardboard must be cut to three or four foot lengths and tied with a string.

Metals. No *loose* lids - trap inside can or discard. Clean tin cans (soup, juice, etc.), aluminum containers (pie plates), aluminum cans (beverages).

Glass. Empty, clean, and discard lids -*labels* are okay. Jars and bottles **ONLY**, i.e., pickle, jam, ketchup, or beverages. No other type of *glass* is acceptable.

Plastic. Discard caps and lids then empty, rinse, and squish. Household cleaner bottles, soft drink and beverage bottles, detergent or fabric softener bottles, plastic bottles, milk jugs, margarine, yogurt containers are all acceptable. Be sure plastic contains a recycle symbol.
